

Sense College East (SCE) - Job Description

Post: Senior SEND Tutor

Responsible to: Education Service Manager

Accountable to: College Principal via Vice Principal

Location: Sense College East sites as advertised.

Description of Role

You will be a Senior SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) Tutor within a small team delivering education programmes to students aged 16-25 with a range of sensory and profound physical disabilities.

You will have oversight of the planning, teaching and assessment of a small cohort of learners, reporting on progress and achievement against Education, Health and Care Plans outcomes.

You will play a key role in the development and performance management of a limited number of staff. Acting as a mentor to new and developing staff and carrying out observations and learning walks to support effective curriculum implementation.

Sense is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of learners and expects all staff to share this commitment. You will be expected to work within the DfE Keeping Children Safe in Education guidelines and adhere to Safer Recruitment practices.



Key Responsibilities

- 1. Plan and deliver effective learning programmes for a small group of SEND students aged 16-19
- 2. You will lead on an area of the curriculum ensuring it is up to date, relevant and meeting the needs of all students
- 3. To carry out specialist assessments to determine key learning aims for students
- **4.** You will work with the Vice Principal Curriculum and Quality to provide mentoring support to new and developing members of the education team
- **5.** You will carry out observations and learning walks as part of your mentoring role and to support wider college quality improvement
- **6.** You will deliver training on your lead area and others to ensure staff have the knowledge and skills to deliver the curriculum and support the learning of all students
- 7. To undertake the full line management role for a small number of education staff
- 8. Plan for and lead EHCP review meetings for a small group of students
- **9.** Maintain and update your knowledge of specialist educational research to develop evidence based practice
- 10. Evaluate your practice with others and assess its impact on learning
- 11. Manage and promote positive student behaviour
- **12.** Motivate and inspire students to promote achievement and develop their skills to enable progression into adulthood
- **13.** Promote the benefits of technology and support students in its use
- **14.** Address the mathematics and English needs of students and work creatively to overcome individual barriers to learning
- **15.** Enable students to share responsibility for their own learning and assessment, setting goals that stretch and challenge
- **16.** Contribute to organisational development and quality improvement through collaboration with internal and external professionals
- 17. To plan and lead educational activities on or off-site, as required



- **18.** Research and develop new learning activities and teaching materials, including online resources and remote learning
- **19.** To develop expertise by undertaking additional qualifications in specialist areas as required e.g. MSI, PMLD, autism, BSL
- **20.** Represent the college at EHCP reviews and reviews of learning with parents, taster days, open days and transition events
- **21.** Attend to the persons' physical and personal specialist care requirements as required by the individual needs of the person.

Other Duties

- 1. The main duties of the post are outlined above, but these may be subject to review and amendment according to the needs and the development of the service.
- 2. The post holder may be required to undertake other duties as appropriate to the post, or subject to service need elsewhere on a temporary basis.
- 3. The post holder may be required to undertake any other duties as instructed by the College Principal / Vice Principals and Education Service Managers.
- 4. The post holder may be required to work across all college sites/centres, with occasional overnight stays.
- 5. Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of Sense College East.
